

**MISS JOB'S DAUGHTER OF DELAWARE
SCHOLARSHIP PAGEANT COMMITTEE
Rules and Regulations**

ARTICLE I

Title

The title of this position shall be Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware, Job's Daughter International.

ARTICLE II

Object

The object is to be a representative of Job's Daughters International of Delaware for the purpose of promoting the interest, welfare, and growth of the Organization; to bring the Daughters of all Bethels and other Jurisdictions into a closer relationship with each other and the Jurisdictional Guardian Council; to serve as a Daughter public relations emissary to adult organizations of the Masonic family and the public in general; to represent Delaware in the Miss International Job's Daughter Pageant.

ARTICLE III

Supervision

Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware shall be under the general supervision of the Jurisdictional Guardian; however, such supervision shall be consistent with the available financial resources of the Daughter.

ARTICLE IV

Qualifications

Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware shall be an intelligent young woman, who possesses a thorough knowledge of the Organization. She must have dignity, poise, charm, good manners. She must be able to meet the public, speak extemporaneously, and represent the Organization with dignity and youthful charm.

ARTICLE V

Eligibility

Section 1.

- (a) The Daughter shall be a member in good standing, have no more than six (6) excused absences per Pageant year and have no more than three (3) excused absences per term and have no unexcused absences. The Daughter shall also be a member of a Delaware Bethel one (1) year preceding the Pageant and must have passed her proficiency. She shall be at least sixteen (16) years of age by the date of the Miss JDI Pageant, and less than twenty (20) years of age at the time of her selection as Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware
- (b) A previous Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware shall not be eligible to compete in the Pageant.
- (c) If Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware is selected as Miss International Job's Daughter, she shall retain her title as Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware.
- (d) If Miss Job's Daughter cannot attend the Supreme Session, the first runner-up may be sent in her place. If the first runner-up cannot attend, the selection may be made from the second runner-up, etc.
- (e) If Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware does not compete in the Supreme Pageant, funds allocated toward her trip to Supreme Session shall be given to the Daughter who represents Delaware.

Section 2.

- (a) In the event that the Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware cannot fulfill her term, the first runner-up shall become the new Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware; if unable to accept, selection shall be made in succession of the runners-up.
- (b) A Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware, Miss Congeniality of Delaware or a Miss Jr. Jobie of Delaware, who marries or becomes pregnant during her reign forfeits her title.

ARTICLE VI
Selection

Section 1.

Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware shall be selected by competition at a pageant to be held on a date selected by the Jurisdictional Guardian and the Pageant Committee.

Section 2.: Requirements for judging:

- (a) Ritual Quiz
 - (1) This quiz, based on Ritual only, shall consist of an examination. Completed quiz paper shall have an assigned number only, not the contestant's name or Bethel number.
- (b) Ritual recitation (oral) given in complete regalia. Judging will be by Ritual Judges.
 - (1) Each Contestant shall recite a Messengers initiation lecture. The lecture will be chosen by the Pageant Committee. The contestant will be informed prior to the Pageant, what lecture they have to recite. Judging shall be on accuracy and presentation.
 - (2) Official regalia shall be inspected for conformity to rules and regulations either before or after recitations, not during.
- (c) Interview by Pageant Judges.
 - (1) Each contestant shall have a private interview with the panel of Pageant Judges. The length of the interview shall be determined by the Pageant Committee prior to the Pageant depending on the number of contestants entered in the Pageant.
 - (2) Judges shall be provided with a fact sheet on each contestant giving her age, education, training, interest, ambitions, and Job's Daughter achievements.
 - (3) Each contestant shall be judged on her personality, diction, sincerity, manners, adaptability to the situation and general impression.
- (d) Stage appearance, judged by Pageant Judges
 - (1) The dress will be evening gown.
 - (2) The judging shall encompass the total picture the contestant presents, considering her personality, carriage, posture, poise, grace of movement, appropriate (for her) hair style and personal grooming.
 - (3) Semi-finalists shall be judged, not only on the response to a question, but to the overall impression the contestant makes as she responds.
 - (4) Should a tie result, it shall be broken by determining the highest combined written Quiz, Recitation, Interview, and Robe Judging scores for those contestants.

ARTICLE VII

Miss Congeniality of Delaware shall be selected by a secret vote of the contestants present at the scheduled voting time.

ARTICLE VIII

Miss Junior Jobie of Delaware shall be selected by secret vote of the junior participants present at the scheduled voting time.

Article IX
Duties of Miss Job's Daughter and
Miss Congeniality of Delaware

Section 1.

- (a) Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware shall:
 - (1) Whenever possible visit Bethels, State Pageants, Grand & Jurisdictional Bethels, and other Daughter related activities to promote the good of the Order.
 - (2) Represent the ideals of Job's Daughters at Masonic and Masonic related functions and other events when requested to do so by the Jurisdictional Guardian.

Section 2.

- (a) Miss Congeniality of Delaware shall:
 - (1) Whenever possible visit Bethels, State Pageants, Grand & Jurisdictional Bethels, and other Daughter related activities to promote the good of the Order.

Section 3.

- (a) Miss Junior Jobie of Delaware shall:
 - (1) Whenever possible visit Bethels, State Pageants, Grand & Jurisdictional Bethels, and other Daughter related activities to promote the good of the Order.

ARTICLE X
Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware
Pageant Committee

Section 1.

- (a) The incoming Jurisdictional Guardian shall appoint a Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware Pageant Chairperson
- (b) The Chairperson shall select four (4) members of the Jurisdictional Guardian Council to be members of the committee with the approval of the Jurisdictional Guardian.
- (c) The Chairman shall keep a permanent file which shall be turned over to his or her successor. This shall include samples of unused Tally Sheets, Score Sheets and Ritual Tests.

ARTICLE XI
Duties of the Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware
Pageant Committee

Section 1.

- (a) The authority and duties shall encompass the total administration including promotion and production of the Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware Scholarship Pageant.

Section 2.

- (a) The Chairman shall confer with the Jurisdictional Guardian to determine:
 - (1) Room and facilities requirements for all Pageant activities.
 - (2) Dates and times of Pageant activities.

Section 3.

- (a) Miss Job's Daughter of Delaware Scholarship Pageant funds, after all expenses for the Pageant have been paid shall be made available to the Educational Scholarship Committee to be awarded as scholarships.

ARTICLE XII
Revisions

Section 1.

One copy of any proposed revision to these Rules and Regulations shall be submitted in writing to the Jurisdictional Secretary at least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Session of the JGC.
